RULES GOVERNING APPLICATIONS FOR THE AWARD OF AN ASSOCIATE OF THE IAC (AACI)

(for Video Makers)

(An alternative application form is available for Audio-Visual producers)

- 1) This distinction is granted by the IAC Council for attainment in movie-making.
- 2) Applicants must be full individual or principal family members of the IAC of at least three continuous years. Associate members, affiliated clubs or groups are not eligible.
- 3) Applications should be made in writing to the Fellowships Officer on the official form, enclosing £4 non-returnable administration cost.
- 4) To qualify, applicants must have accumulated at least four points as follows. In addition, the portfolio of work earning the four points must include at least one IAC 5 Star (or previous Gold) award winning film/video.
 - A Five Star Award (Gold Standard Award prior to 2006) in the IAC International Film and Video Competition will be worth two points.
 - An IAC 4 Star Award (Silver Standard Award prior to 2006) in the IAC International Film and Video Competition will be worth one point.

Documentary evidence of these awards may be required.

- 5) Each movie or A-V sequence must have been made in the name of the applicant or with the applicant in the role of Director. Competition entries by a club, group or society will not count.
- 6) No film or part thereof may be used by any other applicant.
- 7) All videos to be covered by appropriate copyright licences.
- 8) To ensure this is adhered to, the Fellowships Officer will keep a full and careful catalogue of all applications.
- 9) If an applicant is successful the Fellowship will remain in force only as long as the holder possesses a currently valid IAC subscription receipt.
- 10) Successful applicants may style themselves as Associate of the IAC Film and Video Institute (AACI)
- 11) It is the responsibility of the Fellowships Officer to ensure that all rules and regulations are scrupulously observed. Also that all reports and correspondence are treated with due expediency and confidentiality.
- 12) In the event of any dispute the Fellowships Officer's decision is final.
