Many clubs are suffering from falling numbers because of illness and old age. Laurie Calvert joined the team in 2009. Being Internet focussed, Laurie has done an excellent job of setting up the North Thames Region website and teaching the rest of us about Youtube. He has also encouraged us to increase the use of email, hence the setting up of the North Thames Clubs contacts list, which is much easier than posting letters! Laurie has also taken on the task of Minute Secretary for our Council Meetings, which means the minutes arrive at the speed of light (along with all the tasks) after each meeting. Having set up the North Thames website, can I encourage you all to email articles etc to be added to it, or to create a link to Youtube for your club films.



'Social Media' is just a term used to describe social activities on the Internet. YouTube, Facebook, Twitter, etc, these are all ways people use to socialise these days apart from the usual ways such as by phone and actually meeting. These new techniques are useful for those living far apart, and are also great for like-minded people getting in touch. For example, I might be hard pushed to find 50 rocketeers living in Hornchurch (in fact I only know of one) but I have about 50 YouTube subscribers that are just subscribing to me for my rocket videos, and these people are all around the world, sharing experiences with me.

But this week something strange happened that really showed how all of this stuff can come into its own, and so I thought I'd share the experience with you.

On Sunday my sons, Laurie & Jon, ages 15 and 13 respectively, bought a pedal car at a car boot sale for £8. We had the idea to make an affectionate spoof of one of our favourite TV shows, Wheeler Dealers, in which the presenters buy a classic car, repair what is faulty, then hopefully sell it on for a profit. By Tuesday it was in the can and uploaded to YouTube, although I must admit we had worked on it non-stop. This digital version I emailed to the Wheelers Dealers' web site, just to let them know it was there in the hope one of the presenters might see it and get some enjoyment from it.

Within three hours Mike Brewer, one of the shows presenters had personally messaged me via YouTube, saying how taken he was with it, and that me and the kids had done a great job. We were really pleased with that. He even put the first comment up. But he also said he would advertise it on his web site, which he did, and also he made a 'tweet' about it on Twitter (a site in which you can announce a short statement), and also made a link to it on Facebook (a site for friends to share experiences). I also used a car forum to write about this experience. Within two days it had over 1,000 viewings (half the IAC membership to put it in perspective) and some really nice comments were made by people. It was a pleasure to see so many

Mike also got in touch with me via Facebook, made me a friend, and then sent me an email suggesting that myself and my boys go and meet him and the other presenter Edd China at the NEC Motor Show in three months time. I believe he wants to invite the boys on stage in some way. He is currently seeing what he can organise. As I write this, it is Thursday. So in a shade over four days a film we have made has had a profound effect on

many levels, just due to the electronic marvel we call the internet. Now that's entertainment!

Tickets at the door will cost £5, which will include morning tea / coffee and afternoon refreshments.



Chairman Tim Stannard commented, "8mm or 16mm film has not been shown at the club for many years and so dropping the word "ciné" from the club name seemed as obvious as adding the word "video", which we did back in 1990. The word "society" is now almost archaic as a term for a small group of people and "Staines Video Club" rather suggests a VHS rental organisation! We settled on Video Makers because it accurately describes both the fact that we work in a visual medium and that we are involved in making, rather than just watching, videos"


