Poynton & Stockport Movie Makers ... From Humble Beginnings to 57yrs

Stockport Amateur Cine Society was formed in 1957 after Stockport Council approached Manchester Cine Society to Produce a film dealing with Safety in the Home. A group of Members living nearest to Stockport agreed to make the film.

One of our founders, Derek Tommis developed an interest in Cine at school, and soon became a member of the IAC, Two other members Bob and Cyril Smith being engineers, made there own 16mm Camera and projector. I Joined in 1960, when members used 16 mm, 9.5 mm, Standard 8 projectors (including my Bell Howell Sundial), at that time only one Lady member, Marjorie Vickerstaff, who was still making movies in her nineties but sadly is no longer with us. We meet on a Thursday every fortnight. We have a membership of 24 with an average of 18 in attendance. (we do have more Ladies now-a-days).

We have been in many venues over the years, but they have proved unsuitable, due to a vast increase in rent, too many stairs, sound projectors picking up Taxi companies, restricted meeting times, Pubs (too many members called to the Bar) and even a hall that burnt down. In the 90's we moved into our present Headquarters in Poynton just a few miles from Stockport Town Centre, hence the name change to 'Poynton & Stockport Movie Makers'

Alan Williams & Alister Macrae are our Techno Team, they are regularly invited to give shows of members films to a wide range of local groups. John Newton still writes his Column in Tripod, but has handed over his Secretarial reins after 30yrs to Marjorie Gregory who is also our Web Master.

We still have an annual show with 2 sections, up to 5 mins & up to 15 mins. We used to make group films but in the present 'Digital' era it's individual efforts only. As well as exchanging Disc Programmes with other clubs up & down the country, we also have exchange visits with Altrincham, Cheadle & Gatley and Warrington Clubs. Progressive Scan !

I don't know about you folks down there, but I have to confess that I had considerable difficulty understanding the article in Film & Video Maker written by Tom Hardwick, which dealt with a relative rare affliction suffered by amateur Movie Makers.

The technical name for the disease which can apparently strike without warning at any time in the 'Editing Season' is 'Progressive Scan' and "its symptoms are, without doubt, bizarre" to say the least, a Movie Maker in the throws of an attack of 'P.S.' sets up a movie camera on a tripod in the garden and then without any obvious motivation proceeds to walk round it, at the same time pulling the Pan handle in a 360 degree arc. Often at this time the victim suffers a 'Flickering of the interface' which can be extremely painful and embarrassing '

Fortunately treatment is available but rather drastic, it requires complete isolation from any form of digital equipment and lengthy exposure to 8 mm. This 'aversion therapy' is generally successful and the patient can slowly be restored to health over a period of time.

Unfortunately it seems that other forms of this dreadful disease have mutated over the last few months and are reported to be spreading north of Watford. A variation known as 'Synchro Scan' appeared suddenly in Clag - Heaton recently, which responded to treatment from a new drug from 'Premier Pharmaceuticals'. This drug is still experimental but can be obtained on prescription under the trade name of 'Title Safe'. Elsewhere reports have been coming in of cases of 'Clear' and 'Over Scan' both being obvious mutations from the original infection.

North West Region Film & Video Festival Competition Rules

- 1. Entry in the **RHYL CUP COMPETITION** is open to all films or videos made by Clubs or Groups in the region ie. Films or videos made by the collaboration of at least two members on behalf of the club or group.
- 2. Entry in the **NORTH WEST TROPHY COMPETITION** is open to all films or videos made by Individuals living in the region.
- 3. Films or videos previously entered into The **NORTH WEST** competitions are **NOT** eligible unless **MAJOR** re-work has been done.
- 4. Films or videos entered by people under the age of 25 on the closing date will be considered for the Region's **SPECIAL AWARD FOR YOUTH**.
- 5. All films or videos should have been completed within the last two years.
- 6. Besides The Rhyl Cup, North West Trophy and The Youth Award, all entries will be considered for the following additional awards: **BEST FILM/VIDEO**, **BEST EDITING**, **BEST USE OF SOUND**, **BEST TITLES** or **GRAPHICS** and Best Acting: The **MERLIN TROPHY** and **BEST DOCUMENTARY** will be awarded to the entry chosen by the audience present on the day of the Festival.
- Entries must be received by the Competitions Officer, at the address on the Entry Form. Each Film or Video must be accompanied by a completed entry form, with the appropriate Entry Fee, as Follows: Films and Videos entered by people aged 17 and Under on 30th September, or by IAC Individual members and affiliated societies, will be NO CHARGE.

Film or Videos submitted by Non Members will pay £4.00 per Entry. Entrants who do not intend to collect their film or videos at the Festival should enclose a stamped addressed envelope with adequate postage on it. However the Regional Council hopes that Entrants in The Rhyl Cup would arrange for a Club or Group representative, and Entrants of the North West Trophy would arrange for an individual representative, to be present to receive any award that may have been made. Entrants are strongly advised to use either Registered Post or Signed for delivery for the transit of their entries.

- 8. The Makers of the winning films or videos shall hold their Trophies for one year, and shall receive such other mementos as the Regional Council shall decide. Winners will be expected to return trophies to the Competition Officer, by the competition entry date, for the 2012 Competition.
- 9. Film and Videos entered must be capable of being projected and replayed on standard equipment generally available.
- 10. Any entry which exceeds 20 minutes in length will be judged, but it will not necessarily be shown shown in full, at the Festival.
- 11. The Organisers would prefer film sound to be on film, either applied or magnetic. Tape entries conforming to the recommended code of practice for sound synchronization will, however, be accepted. Entries with sound on twin track magnetic will also be accepted, but it should be noted that the organizers cannot be held responsible for the ...? Of such sound. Both tracks will reproduced at the SAME volume setup, The Organisers may however, refuse an entry, or Project it as a silent film, if no suitable equipment is available.
- 12. All copyright material MUST be cleared by the entrant. The Competition Officer reserves the right to require evidence of such clearance prior to the exhibition of an entry and the copyright licence number or, in the case of copyright free material, the supplier's receipt number should be shown on the entry form.
- 13. All films and videos entered in the competitions will be submitted to the judging panel for adjudication and comment. However, The Organisers cannot guarantee that all films and videos entered will be screened at the Festival. The judging panel will be asked to select a BALANCED programme for showing within the available screen time.
- 14. Unless the maker objects, Festival Organisers may make a duplicate copy of the entries, for showing to other amateur groups, but the copyright remains the property of the movie maker(s).
- 15. The Organisers, whilst taking every reasonable care of the films and videos submitted, cannot accept any responsibility for loss or damage whilst in their possession.
- 16. The Competition Officer reserves the right to copy all entries digitally onto Mini DV or DVD for admission to the judging panel. Such copying will in no way infringe the maker's copyright and will be done to ensure the security of the entries, reduce transport costs and generally inprove the efficiency of the administration. Such digital copies will be destroyed on receipt of the judging panel's adjudication and erased from the computer hard drive.
- 17. Films and Videos will be returned at the Festival. Where they will be available for collection. Any not collected will be **returned as soon as possible afterwards.**
