The good news is that we have received 42 entries for the SERIAC Film Festival, which by coincidence is the same as last year – and a very healthy amount.

Thanks to all of you who entered our SERIAC Competition and all 68 of you who came to the Festival on 12th May. Thankfully, all went well and we received lots of praise for the day's event. The ploughman's platters worked well, saving long queues.

Many thanks to Joy Prosser for providing the scrumptious cakes.

We managed to show 36 of the 42 films in the allotted time, with at least one film from [Thanks to North Thames Region for doing all the pre- and final judging](#) each entrant being shown. Thanks must go to North Thames Region for doing



all the pre- and final judging for the competition. Last year for the first time Freddy Beard and I awarded three Competition Officers Certificates to recognise films that had not otherwise received any awards. We therefore decided to do this again this year. I have heard that some don't agree with this, but we felt that as we have such an impressive number of entries each year, it's a little thank you from us to add to the awards. Considering that the audience get a vote in deciding the Alex Dove Trophy, then why not us hard working Competition Officers! It also means more entrants receive an award – we hope inspiring them to make and enter more films in our competitions in future. ## ATTENTION ALL FILM MAKERS FROM KENT AND SOUTH EAST LONDON!

Hi there

I know a lot of you have been making brand new films, so, why not enter one or more of them for the **2017 Kent Film Festival**?

All residents of Kent or South East London (and members of film making clubs in those areas) are eligible to enter their non-professional films for the Kent Film Festival (KFF). It only costs £6 pounds to enter a film (only £5 for IAC members). Films can be entered via DVD, Blu-Ray or on a USB stick. Once again we are also allowing entrants to send in films digitally via **WeTransfer** which is free of charge; just go to WeTransfer.com and follow the instructions. You may win one of the many awards and trophies on offer. Young people and students are particularly encouraged to take part (no charge once again for those under 21).



We use independent experienced film makers as our judges and all entrants who want them receive constructive comments on their films. Most entrants will see their film on the big screen and excellent sound stage in a cinema style theatre at the Festival in front of an appreciative audience. Most entries are shown.

The KFF is well worth attending, even if you don't enter a film. The location is The Powell Theatre in Canterbury Christchurch University, in the heart of Canterbury. The date is **Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> of September** and the start time is 11am. But we must have films to show, so please make every effort to enter your films to help make this Festival yet another great success.

The closing date for entries is **Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> July**. You can find an entry form in the last (May/June) edition of SERIAC News or you can print it direct from our website [www.kentfilmfestival.com](http://www.kentfilmfestival.com) which has details of where to send your entry, the competition rules and other details of the event.

As long as your film hasn't been entered at Kent before and you satisfy the eligibility criteria, you can enter. So go on, be part of this friendly film festival!

# SUSSEX FILM FESTIVAL RULES

- 1 An amateur movie** is deemed to be one that is made exclusively for the joy and challenge of making it, with no profit motive involved and without creative or other professional assistance other than film or video copying.
  - 2 Entrants** must be resident, a member of a club or attending a college in East Sussex, West Sussex or the Channel Islands. The same entry may not be submitted to more than one County Festival, but makers are encouraged to also enter the annual SERIAC Festival (the next step after the County festivals) which is run by the IAC's South East Region.
  - 3 Young Movie Makers** are deemed to be under 20 years of age on the closing date, and should declare what adult assistance they received, if any.
  - 4 Club entries** should be submitted from the address of an elected official of the club or society, which must be affiliated to the IAC. Club entries should be movies made and financed by the club - individuals' films entered under the banner of "Club" are not permitted.
  - 5 Media Formats** accepted are DVD, Blu-Ray Disc or mp4/AVI / Quicktime file only and, if possible at 25 frames per second. Blu-Ray entries must be accompanied by a standard DVD version for judging purposes. Entries must be clearly marked with title, entrant's name and address. Usb sticks should be tagged with this information. Discs or usb sticks should contain only the entered movie and no other content.
  - 6 Any previous entry** to this Festival will not be eligible for re-entry unless it has been significantly revised.
  - 7 A completed and signed Entry Form** (photocopies acceptable) must accompany each movie submitted. All competitors must enclose a cheque made payable to the Sussex Film Festival or set up a bank transfer covering the entry fee and return postage for those not collecting their entry from the Festival. All entries must be received by the Competition Officer by the closing date.
  - 8 Any copyright** in picture and/or sound must be cleared by the entrant. This includes any pictures or sound recorded from broadcast or professional video sources. Copyright clearance authority (e.g. IAC licence) must be quoted unless non-copyright or no music has been used.
  - 9 One-Minute entries** must be no longer than 60 seconds from the first picture or sound to the last picture or sound.
  - 10 All entries** will be handled with care, but the Festival organisers cannot accept liability for loss or damage, however caused.
  - 11 The decision of the judges** will be final. The judges reserve the right to abandon viewing of any entry after 20 minutes if, in their opinion, it is not of adequate quality.
  - 12 The Festival Show** will include as many movies as possible, but the organisers reserve the right to show extracts and to select from all the entries to make a balanced programme acceptable to the expected audience.
- On any matters of interpretation or other issues not covered by these rules, the decision of the SFF committee will be final.**




Tim Stannard's film "Miracle on the Mantlepiece" won the SERIAC Cup and the Colin Pain Trophy



Howard Perry gained the Marina and Alex Dove Trophies for "Cuttings"






Matthew Mahoney received the acting award for his performance in **Fall of a King**
